Dear Foggy View. Although I am in a field and many miles from home, I like to keep in touch with people. Can you suggest any useful Email address. –Sarah

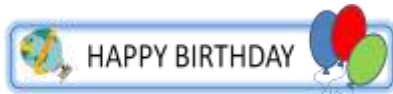
