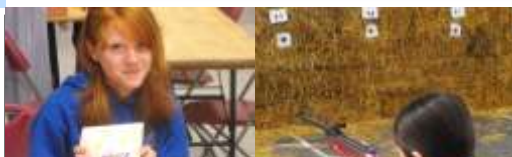

It's The Last Day Of Activities Make the Most of Today & Try Something New!



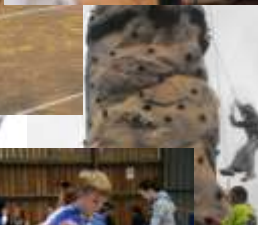
